


European Installed Capacity Trends

Climate Action Plan – commitments



Route to Market for Renewable Electricity Generation

- Action 28 Design and implement the RESS. Increase the volumes and frequencies of RESS auctions to deliver on the 70% renewable electricity target by 2030. Ensure an appropriate community/ enterprise mix to achieve an efficient delivery of renewables
- Action 29 Ensure that 15% of electricity demand is met by renewable sources contracted under Corporate PPAs


Corporate PPA in Climate Action Plan



- Action 29 what does this mean?
- This target would require 1.4 3.4GW (depending on demand/output assumptions) of renewable generation capacity contracted under CPPAs.
- Develop effective policy tools to harness the significant potential of Corporate PPAs to meet at least 15% of Ireland's 2030 electricity demand from renewable sources.

Winner Selection



- Technology neutral framework with any diversity signals to be finalised
- Pay As Bid: Selected offers will be based on the strike price specified in their offer. Offers to be selected in ascending price order
- The auction quantity for RESS 1 is expected to be between 1- 3,000GWhr.
- Support to be provided through a 2 way support arrangement through Floating Feed in Premium comparing a strike price (bid price) with a reference market price, on the basis of metered output.
- Support for a successful project will last up to 15 years.

Successes for RESS-1 Project



- ✓ RESS-1 incentivises speedy connection of required quantity of renewable electricity generation to meet Ireland's 2030 targets.
- Offer prices bid into RESS-1 are competitive and consumer costs are minimised
- ✓ RESS-1 auction takes place within the timelines set out in the Climate Action Plan
- ✓ Diversification of the mix in the RESS-1 auction if competitive.
- ✓ Strong community participation in RESS-1

Wind Energy Development Guidelines



- Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government (DHPLG) and DCCAE are working together in order to achieve the Programme for Government commitment to a review of the 2006 Wind Energy Guidelines covering: noise, proximity, shadow flicker, community consultation, community dividend and grid connection.
- Close to finalisation with the intention of a public consultation on the revised guidelines this quarter (Q4 2019).
- The proposed new guidelines will be subject to Strategic Environmental Assessment and associated public consultation (c. 8 weeks) before they are finalised by Government.

Offshore wind energy – key pillars



- Financing & route to market
 - Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS)
- Grid Connection Framework
 - DCCAE chair WG to assess grid models for ORE connections
- Legislative & Regulatory Framework
 - Marine Planning & Development Management Bill
- National Marine Planning Framework (NMPF)
 - Marine Policy Statement
 - Publication of final NMPF
